No cost mobile GP clinic



The Exodus have recently secured a philanthropic grant to put our medical van on the road!

The grant will fund a GP and nurse to provide primary care to marginalised people across Sydney and even NSW. We would like to help clients including people who are at risk of or are homeless, refugee and asylum seekers and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community members. The Van has already been fitted and stocked (including vaccine fridge) from previous funding with the required equipment for a mobile clinic.

We have already started a regular weekly in reach clinic in partnership with Haymarket foundation. We know that many people who cannot easily access our Ashfield clinic are working towards recovery and have unmet physical health needs, so we see our funding as an opportunity to reach people at sites comfortable to them.

We have capacity to do

- Mental Health Metabolic screens with point of care testing for diabetes and cholesterol
- STI/ HIV and hepatitis testing and prescribing (GP is an s100 prescriber)
- Cervical self-collected screen testing/ pathology testing
- Immunisations (incl COVID vaccines/ flu)
- Cardiovascular checks/referrals / care plans
- support letters and medical forms

It would be wonderful to discuss this opportunity with services who might have demand for a GP service and be able to accommodate a regular (monthly/ fortnightly) or even episodic in-reach GP across Sydney (and potentially NSW). The bus itself can be used but if there is clinic/ office space available we would happily use it =)
