As Mental Health Coordinating Council celebrates its milestone 40th anniversary, the occasion provides an opportunity to reflect on the progress of the community-managed mental health sector in New South Wales over the last four decades.

Short history

Four decades ago, the mental health sector in NSW was changing dramatically. Old institutions were closing, funding for community services was growing and the emphasis shifting to recovery and hope.

- In 1983 a group of dedicated mental health advocates began meeting over lunch on a monthly basis. This informal meeting was motivated by a desire to turn a loose group of poorly funded community organisations into a sector that improved the lives of people with lived experience of mental health.
- The founding organisations in those early days were Aftercare (Stride), ARAFMI, Grow, NSW Mental Health Association (WayAhead), the PALA Society and Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association (taken over by Richmond Fellowship, now Flourish).
- In the early days, advocacy centred on the rights of individuals to live well in the community.
- Since then, MHCC has been at the forefront of advocacy, working to support the rights of individuals and building strong, quality community organisations able to support positive outcomes for people with lived experience of mental health.
